Profile.

Registration.

Feeling the agony and suffering being faced by the unfortunate section of our society, the founding fathers decided to pool their efforts and resources for the betterment of humanity at large. After an initial period of organizing and working on a smaller canvass, formal registration under the Societies Registration Act XXI of 1860 was obtained for Kakayzai Association Pakistan with the Registrar, Joint Stock Companies at Lahore on 2nd September 1975 under ref no: RP/82 of 1975-1976.

Aims & Objectives.

The primary aim of the Association is to serve the needy and down-trodden section of our society who are vulnerable, and in need of dire help. Striving towards these objectives, the Association endeavours to alleviate their anguish through various projects.

Head Office.

The head office of the Association was shifted to its present location after the building was formally inaugurated by the late Sheikh Ghias Muhammad, retired Attorney General, West Pakistan. With passage of time and progression, the Association having expanded operates through local chapters in different cities.

Organizational Set-up.

An elected President heads the Association, who is supported by the Executive Committee comprising of Vice-President, Secretary General, and Secretary Finance besides thirty-five Executive Members who also head some of the ancillary committees. The Executive Committee meets on the first Sunday of every month. Minutes are recorded and circulated along with the agenda. General Body Meetings are held annually.

Finances.

Besides voluntary contributions from Executive Members, special fund raising efforts organised for a specific project, zakaat donations, and sale-proceeds from hides of sacrificial animals generate the necessary funds for the execution and running of the projects.

Financial Assistance Programmes.

Programmes covered under this scheme are directly overseen by the relevant sub-committees. Details of various programmes being implemented are :-
